### Which need is to be fulfilled?

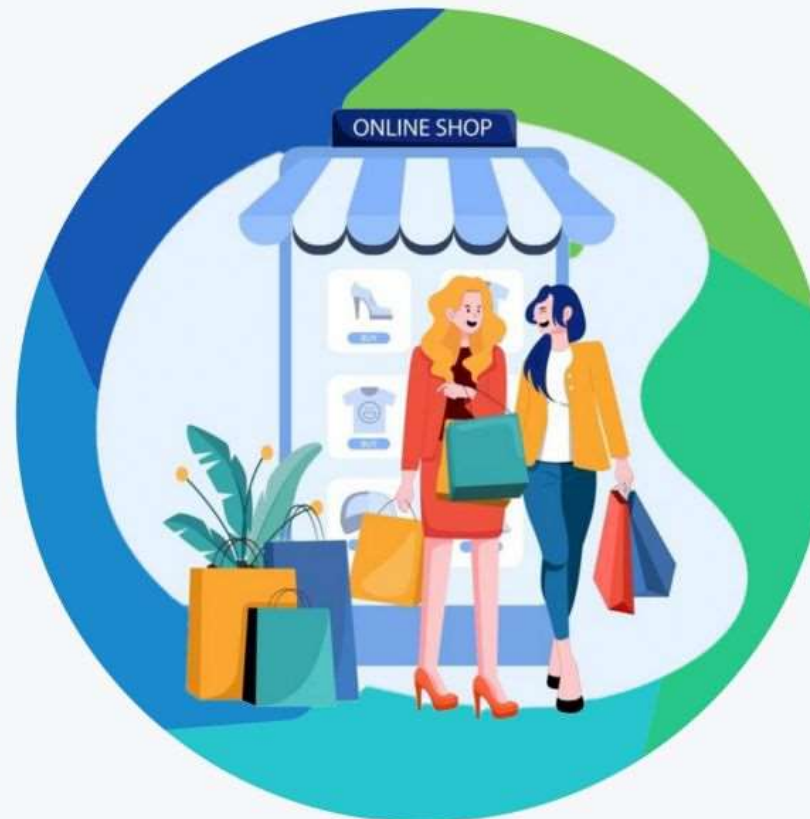
Many people desire excellent apparel but lack the funds to purchase new attire.

## 5. Agency For Home-based Care

### Which need is to be fulfilled?

### Who to sell to?

### How to sell?

I would establish an agency, market my services online, through local doctors and hospitals, and publish ads in neighborhood newspapers

## 5. Garbage Collection



### Which need is to be fulfilled?

Many people lament that the municipal authority does not offer a regular, frequent collection service for their trash and that they do not know where to dispose of it. Additionally, there isn't a publicly accessible landfill where individuals can dump their rubbish.

### What good/service?

A company that collects trash. Recycling materials like plastics, metals, paper, and textiles can generate additional cash in addition to doing a much-needed service and charging for it. I might be given a job by the local government. A acquaintance who used to work in the division in charge of garbage collection was able to provide me with advice.

### Who to sell to?

Since we would be offering a community service, there should be a large number of customers eager to pay to dispose of their trash. We would create accounts for each home and business in the neighborhood once we have a disposal site and have purchased trucks to collect trash. We would then connect with businesses who recycle waste to have them buy the recyclable materials from us.

### How to sell?

Direct payment. Vehicles and drivers would require start-up funding. However, a push cart that can be used to gather domestic trash has been promoted by a local NGO for environmental conservation. I could also begin small by using a push cart and assembling a group of unemployed young people from the neighborhood to begin offering the service, and then I could grow the business as cash came in to purchase garbage collecting trucks.
